Philippa welcomed everyone, introduced our guest speaker and outlined the Agenda for the meeting.

Matters Arising:

Brigid Lobrey (Volunteer & Corporate Speaker) – Hypo Hounds

Brigid firstly introduced Chip, a trainee Hypo Hound and Chip's foster parents Sally & Katie.

Brigid explained that Hypo Hounds was a small Kent (Chart Sutton) based charity that exists to provide assistance dogs to children suffering from Brittle Type 1 Diabetes. The dogs are trained to detect any change in Blood Sugar levels by their sense of smell. This type of Diabetes does not give any early warning signs of change and can be lethal if not dealt with promptly. Once a Hypo Hound detects a change it will alert a carer/parent who can then take action. Experience has shown that the presence of Hypo Hound has reduced the need to a call an ambulance to zero. A trainee puppy

spends its first year with foster parents for basic training (i.e. social skills, recall, etc.) then goes to another set of trainers for advanced skills (smell detection). The assistance of a Hypo Hound will greatly normalise a child's lifestyle.

The charity supports the cost of the Hypo Hound throughout its entire working life and this amounts to £25,000 per hound.
